The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Korea presents its compliments to the Embassy of Canada and has the honor to refer to the latter's note No. 28 dated October 6, 1992, which reads as follows:

'The Canadian Embassy presents its compliments to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Korea and has the honour to refer to the Memorandum of Understanding between the Government of Canada and the Government of the Republic of Korea relating to the export from Korea of certain textiles and textile products for import into Canada (MOU)

In light of the continued delay in the completion of the Uruguay Round of Multilateral Trade Negotiations (MTN), it is clear that the MTN results on textiles and clothing will not be implemented on 1 January 1993, nor has the Textiles committee of the GATT taken a decision on the extension of the arrangement regarding international trade in textiles (MFA) beyond its expiry date of 31 December 1992. Under these circumstances, there is already considerable uncertainty among producers, exporters and importers in Canada and Korea with respect to the rules which will govern our bilateral trade in textiles and clothing in 1993.

In order to alleviate this uncertainty and to provide the trade with a predictable environment in which to plan its activities, the Canadian authorities propose that the MOU be extended until 31 December 1993, or if Korean authorities are agreeable, to 31 December 1994.

This extension would apply to all terms and conditions of the MOU, including growth rates and flexibility provisions; it would also be without prejudice to any changes that may be required to be implemented as a result of a successful conclusion of the Uruguay Round. Therefore, in the event that the MTN results are implemented in 1994, the second year of this extension would be superseded by the restraint structure contained in the MTN agreement.

In the event that the Korean authorities are in agreement with this proposal, the Canadian authorities would propose that this note along with the reply from the Korean authorities constitute an agreement extending the MOU until the date on which we mutually agree.

The Canadian Embassy avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Korea the assurance of its highest consideration.

The Ministry has the further honor to confirm that the proposal contained in the Embassy note is acceptable to the Government of the Republic of Korea and that the Embassy note and this note in reply will constitute an Agreement between our two Governments to renew the said MOU for a period of two years, until December 31, 1994.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Korea avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Embassy of Canada the assurances of its highest consideration.

The Embassy of Canada presents its compliments to the Ministry of Trade and Industry of the Republic of Korea and has the honour to refer to the ad referendum agreement respecting exports of acetate filament fabric from Korea for import into Canada which was signed between officials of the Government of the Republic of Korea and the Government of Canada on June 29, 1992 in Seoul.

The Canadian authorities wish to convey their agreement with the terms of the arrangement contained in the agreed record. They propose that this Note give effect to the terms of the agreed record.

The Embassy of Canada avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Ministry of Trade and Industry the assurances of its highest consideration.

Agreed Record of Discussions

1. Delegations representing the Governments of Canada and of the Republic of Korea met on June 26, 1992, in Seoul pursuant to the request by Canada for consultations under paragraphs 28 and 29 of the Memorandum of Understanding between the Government of Canada and the Government of the Republic of Korea relating to the export from Korea of certain textiles and textile products for import into Canada (MOU), and under Article 3 of the Arrangement Regarding International Trade in Textiles, relative to the export from Korea of acetate filament fabric.
2. The two delegations agreed that exports from Korea of acetate filament fabric to Canada would be subject to the following arrangements. These arrangements will apply to "Acetate filament fabric, containing 85% or more by weight of acetate filament yarn". This product is classified under the following headings of the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (H.S.) : 5408.21, 5408.22, 5408.23, 5408.24. (These arrangement do not extend to rayon fabric which is also classified under these headings). This product will become item 31 of Annexes I and II of the MOU.
3. Exports of acetate filament fabric from Korea to Canada will be subject to the annual quantitative limits set forth in the Annex to this Agreed Record. These arrangements will be implemented on July 20, 1992. For the period July 20, 1992, to December 31, 1992, exports of this product from Korea to Canada will be limited to 210,000 kilograms.
4. This Agreed Record and its Annex will become Annex III of the MOU, subject to the terms and conditions of the MOU.
5. This Agreed Record will become effective subsequent to a note from the Canadian authorities confirming their acceptance of these arrangements.

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## AGREED RECORD OF DISCUSSIONS

1. Delegations representing the Governments of Canada and of the Republic of Korea met on June 25-26, 1992, in Seoul, to discuss the conversion of the Memorandum of Understanding between the Government of Canada and the Government the Republic of Korea relating to the Export from Korea of Certain Textiles and Textile Products into Canada (MOU) to an arrangement based on the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (HS).

2. The two delegations agreed that, should the MOU be extended beyond its expiry date of 31 December, 1992, the attached Annexes I and II will, for purposes relating to the extension of the MOU, replace the current Annexes I and II and provide the basis for any discussions relating to this extension. They agreed that in the context of this conversion of the MOU to the HS, the 1993 restraint level for category 35, polyester filament fabric, would be increased by 38,000 kilograms.

3. The two delegation agreed that this conversion is without prejudice to any discussion on the extension of the MOU beyond its expiry date of 31 December, 1992.

**ANNEX II- PREAMBLE****SOUTH KOREA**

1. Unless otherwise indicated, gender means garments for men (M), boys (B) (sizes 8 to 18), women (W), girls (G) (sizes 7 to 16), children (C) (sizes 2 to 6X) and babies, of a body height not exceeding 86 cm (sizes 0 to 24 months).
2. Unless otherwise indicated, swing is permitted from adult garments to children's and babies' garments at a 3 to 5 ratio.
3. A partially manufactured textile article shall be taken to include an article unfinished or incomplete (including cut or shaped fabric for making such articles), provided that, as presented, the incomplete or unfinished article has the essential character of the complete or finished article. It shall also be taken to include the article presented unassembled or disassembled.
4. Garments of indeterminate gender, including unisex garments, are to be counted as of female gender.
5. Unless otherwise indicated, products covered by restraints under this arrangement in Group I and in Group II are those which predominate by weight of silk, wool, cotton, other vegetable fibres or man-made fibres.  
Excluded are products of Group I containing more than 85% by weight of vegetable fibres, other than cotton, or more than 70% by weight of silk fibres.
6. Unless otherwise indicated, any reference to fabrics includes fabrics impregnated, coated, covered or laminated, where the non-textile substance accounts for 50% or less by weight.
