AGREED RECORD OF DISCUSSIONS

- Delegation of the Government of Canada and of the Government of The Republic of India met on November 30, and December 1-2, 1992 in New Delhi to discuss (a) the extension, beyond December 31, 1992, of the Memorandum of Understanding between the Government of Canada and the Government of the Republic of India relating to the Exports from India of Certain Textiles and Textile Products for Import into Canada (The "MOU") and (b), the conversion of the MOU to an arrangement based on the Harmonized System(The HS) to take effect on January 1, 1993.
- 2) The two delegations agreed to an extension of the MOU for a period of one year, beyond January 1, 1993 and that this MOU would be converted to HS terminology and categorization. Annex I, attached hereto, thus constitutes the framework of the MOU, within which the annual restraint levels, growth rates and flexibility provisions are set out. For the purpose of classifying textiles and textile products in the appropriate HS category, the definitions and notes set out in Annex II, attached, will apply with effect from 1 January, 1993.
- The extension of the MOU is without prejudice to any change which may be made to the Arrangement Regarding International Trade in Textiles from 1 January, 1993. Both sides reserve the possibility of requesting consultations to review the MOU in the event of such changes in the Arrangement.
- 4) This agreement will cease to have effect from the date the Uruguay Round transition arrangement for integration of the textile sector into the GATT comes into force.

ANNEX II- PREAMBLE

<u>INDIA</u>

- 1. Unless otherwise indicated, gender means garments for men (M), boys (B) (sizes 8 to 18), women (W), girls (G) (sizes 7 to 16), children (C) (sizes 2 to 6X) and babies, of a body height not exceeding 86 cm (sizes 0 to 24 months).
- 2. Unless otherwise indicated, swing is permitted from adult garments to children's and babies' garments at a 3 to 5 ratio.
- 3. A partially manufactured textile article shall be taken to include an article unfinished or incomplete (including cut or shaped fabric for making such articles), provided that, as presented, the incomplete or unfinished article has the essential character of the complete or finished article. It shall also be taken to include the article presented unassembled or disassembled.
- 4. Garments of indeterminate gender, including unisex garments, are to be counted as of female gender.
- 5. Unless otherwise indicated, products covered by restraints under this arrangement in Group I and in Group II are those which predominate by weight of wool, cotton, or manmade fibres.

AGREED RECORD OF DISCUSSIONS

- Delegations of the Government of Canada and of the Government of India met on January 28 and 31, 1994 in Ottawa to discuss (a) the extension, beyond 31 January 1994, of the Memorandum of Understanding between the Government of Canada and the Government of India relating to the Exports from India of Certain Textiles and Textile Products for Import into Canada (the "MOU") and (b), the request by Canada for consultations under paragraphs 29-33 of the MOU concerning exports of underwear from India.
- 2) (a) The two delegations agreed to an extension of the MOU. The term of this agreement will be the period from January 1, 1994 through December 31, 1994.
 - (b) Should the Uruguay Round transition arrangement for integration of the textile sector into the GATT not come into force by January 1, 1995, this agreement will be extended for a second year commencing on January 1, 1995. However, any such extension of this bilateral agreement shall be brought into conformity with any successor to the current protocol of extension to the MFA if changes are made therein. This extension applies to all terms and conditions contained in the MOU.
- The two delegations were unable to agree on a restraint level regarding the call on underwear by Canada. In view of the outcome of these discussions, the interim restraint for the MOU year 1994 is established at 3,072,349 units, in accordance with paragraph 29(h) of the MOU. For this category, swing of 7%, carry-over of 11%, carry-forward of 6% and combined flexibility of 18% will be available. The conversion factor will be 0.5 square metres per unit.
- 4) The two delegations agreed that effective January 1, 1994, Annex I to this Agreed Record will replace Annex I of the MOU.

The Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade Canada presents its compliments to the Indian High Commission and wishes to refer to the Agreed Record of 31 January 1994 relating to the arrangement regarding International Trade in Textiles (MFA) and the 1994 interim restraint on underwear.

During continuing talks regarding our call on underwear, an agreement was reached on a restraint level of 5,000,000 units for category 9.0 for the MOU year 1994. For this category, growth of 6%, swing of 7%, carry-over of 11%, carry-forward of 6% and combined flexibility of 18% will be available. The conversion factor will be 0.5 square metres per unit. This sub-category will be added to Annex I of the current MOU as Agreement Item number 9. This Agreement Item is not included in Group A.

The Canadian Authorities propose that this note together with the reply from the Indian Authorities confirming their acceptance of the revised annex I shall constitute an amendment to the MOU which shall be effective January 1, 1994.
