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Dear Ambassador Raffaelli,

Pursuant to Article 4 of the of the Arrangement Regarding International Trade in Textiles (MFA), done at Geneva on 20 December 1973, and to its 1986, 1991, 1992 and 1993 Protocols of Extension and Maintenance in Force, I have the honour to advise you of the extension with modifications of the bilateral Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Canada and Indonesia.

As a result of consultations in October, 1993, Canada and Indonesia agreed to extend the validity of the Agreement until 31 December 1995. In this extension, product coverage remained unchanged, although only two categories remain subject to extended fibre coverage. Growth rates were unchanged although base levels for certain categories were increased by more than the growth rate; flexibility provisions were liberalised for all categories.

Attached please find copy of the October 1993 Agreed Record of Discussions, and of an exchange of Notes confirming this agreement.

Canada-Indonesia Textile and Clothing Consultations

Agreed Record of Discussions

- 1. Delegations representing the Government of Canada and the Government of the Republic of Indonesia met on October 18 and 19, 1993, in Denpasar, to discuss the extension of the Memorandum of Understanding between the Government of Canada and the Government of Indonesia relating to the export from Indonesia of certain textiles and textile products for import into Canada ("the MOU").
- 2. The two delegations agreed to extend the MOU for a 2 year period to December 31, 1995. This extension applies to all terms and conditions contained in the MOU. This extension is without prejudice to any changes which may be negotiated in the Uruguay Round covering trade in textile products.
- 3. The two delegations agreed that effective January 1, 1994, Annexes I and II to this Agreed Record will replace Annexes I and II of the MOU. As a result of discussions between the two delegations it was agreed that with the exception of categories 5A and 11, the clothing products under restraint would no longer be subject to extended fibre coverage.
- 4. The delegations also agreed to replace the annex defining cottage industry products with the attached Annex III. It was also agreed that all products exported under this provision must be certified as meeting the definition of cottage industry products by the Indonesian Department of Trade which will issue a certificate to be attached to the export licence. The Government of Canada will establish a new annex code for Indonesian cottage industry products which will be quoted on the export licence.
- 5. For category 2.0 it was agreed that a special carryover from 1992 of 4,988 units, a carryforward from 1994 of 3,932 units and a special swing from category 10 of 6,291 units would be allowed in 1993.



ANNEX II- PREAMBLE

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- 1. Unless otherwise indicated, gender means garments for men (M), boys (B) (sizes 8 to 18), women (W), girls (G) (\$izes 7 to 16), children (C) (sizes 2 to 6X) and babies, of a body height not exceeding 86 cm (sizes 0 to 24 months).
- 2. Unless otherwise indicated, swing is permitted from adult garments to children's and babies' garments at a 3 to 5 ratio. This note is not applicable to Items 3n, 4, 7/8, nor to swing from these Items into Item 14.
- 3. A partially manufactured textile article shall be taken to include an article unfinished or incomplete (including cut or shaped fabric for making such articles), provided that, as presented, the incomplete or unfinished article has the essential character of the complete or finished article. It shall also be taken to include the article presented unassembled or disassembled.
- 4. Garments of indeterminate gender, including unisex garments, are to be counted as of female gender.
- 5. Unless otherwise indicated, products covered by restraints under this arrangement in Group I and in Group II are those which predominate by weight of wool, cotton, or manmade fibres.
- 6. Extended fibre coverage, which applies to categories 5A and 11, means garments made of fabric containing less than 85% by weight of vegetable fibres, other than cotton, or less than 70% by weight of silk fibres.

Annex III

DEFINITION OF COTTAGE INDUSTRY PRODUCTS

Hand-made cottage industry products are products of a kind traditionally made in the cottage industry, whether sewn by hand or by a hand or foot-operated sewing machine. The products shall be made up of any of the following fabrics:

- a) hand painted or hand printed batik fabrics;
- b) handloom fabrics, such as Ikat; or
- c) fabrics which are hand embroidered or have ornamentation sewn on by hand (such as beads), where the embroidery or ornamentation constitute at least 25 per cent of FOB value.

Batik is produced by a process which involves the following three operations, carried out by hand, for each of the colours or shades applied to the fabric:

- i) Waxing (application of wax by hand to the fabric);
- Dyeing/printing (application of colour either by the traditional cottage method of dyeing or by handprinting); and
- iii) Dewaxing (boiling the fabric to remove the wax).
