Pursuant to Article 4 of the of the Arrangement Regarding International Trade in Textiles (MFA), done at Geneva on 20 December 1973, and to its 1986, 1991, 1992 and 1993 Protocols of Extension and Maintenance in Force, I have the honour to advise you of the extension with modifications of the bilateral Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Canada and Pakistan.

As a result of consultations in December, 1993, Canada and Pakistan agreed to extend the validity of the Agreement until 31 December 1995. In this extension, restraints were removed on one category. Growth rates were unchanged although base levels for two categories were increased by more than the growth rate.

Attached please find copy of the Agreed Record of Discussions extending this agreement.

# Canada-Pakistan Textile and Clothing Consultations Agreed Record of Discussions

- Delegations representing the Government of Canada and the Government of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan met on December 8 9, 1993, in Ottawa, to discuss the extension of the Memorandum of Understanding between the Government of Canada and the Government of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan relating to the export from Pakistan of certain textiles and textile products for import into Canada (MOU).
- The two delegations agreed to extend the MOU for a 24 month period to December 31, 1995. This extension applies to all terms and conditions contained in the MOU. This extension is without prejudice to any changes which may be negotiated in the Uruguay Round covering trade in textile products.
- The Government of Canada agreed to remove restraints for category 4.2 jackets and blazers (WGC) from Agreement Item No. 3/4a. In this respect, the Canadian authorities reserve their rights under the provisions of the Multi-Fibre Arrangement to take appropriate action in the event that future exports of textile and clothing products from Pakistan disrupt or threaten to disrupt the Canadian market.
- 3. The two delegations agreed that effective January 1, 1994, Annex I to this Agreed Record Will replace Annex I of the MOU.
