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Dear Ambassador,

With regard to the Agreement on trade in textile products between the European Community and China negotiated under Article 4 of the Arrangement and initialled on 9 December 1988, as amended by the Exchange of Letters initialled on 8 December 1992, I have to inform you of the following.

During the course of 1993, imports of fishing nets, (Category 97) from China into the Community exceeded the level at which the Community could ask for consultations with a view to establishing a Community limit under the provisions of Article 6 of the Agreement. Since the Community considered that there was a real risk of market disruption in this case, consultations were held on 7 April 1994 under Article 16 of the Agreement. As a result of these consultations, and in accordance with the provisions of the Agreement, China agreed to limit its exports as follows:

These new limits contained in the Agreed Minute annexed to this letter are herewith communicated under Article 4, paragraph 4 of the Arrangement, as a modification to the Community's Agreement with China.

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#### AGREED MINUTE

- Delegations of the European Community and the People's Republic of China met in Beijing from 6 April 1994 to 8 April 1994 in accordance with Articles 6 and 16 of their bilateral Agreement on trade in textiles initialled on 9 December 1988 as amended and extended by the Exchange of Letters initialled in Brussels on 8 December 1992.
- 2. As a result of these consultations, the two parties agreed as follows:
- a) China will limit its exports of products of categories 28, 68 and 97 to the Comunity as follows:

b) The annual limits for the year 1994 are to be applied prorata as set out below:

97	Tonnes	1.433	from 8 February 1994

Products shipped from China before the above-mentioned dates shall not be deducted from the limits established for each of the above-mentioned categories.

c) It is understood that the provisions of the Agreement which concern exports of products subject to the quantitative limits established in Annex III thereto and in particular those relating to the double checking system and flexibility (Article 5 of the Agreement) are also applicable to the products subject to the quantitative limits mentioned in subparagraphs a) and b) above.

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#### Situation in the Community Market of category 97 products (nets, netting and made up fishing nets) Imports from China

Total imports of category 97 products into the Community increased progressively from 1989 to 1992 by 18,5% or by an average of 5,8% per year. During the same period China has almost trebled its exports to the Community market, with an average annual growth of EC-imports from China amounting to more than 42%.

In 1993 China has become the Community's biggest supplier, with an increase of its imports of 223% in the first 6 months. China increased its share in total EC-imports in 3 years from around 6% in 1990 to 36% in the first half of 1993; China's share in imports from all MFA countries having concluded a bilateral agreement with the EC has reached almost 50%.

This continuous extremely high increases in Chinese exports of category 97 products to the Community have created serious difficulties for the European industry. In this context it has to be taken into account that the prices of the Chinese products are exceptionally low; their average level has even decreased every year since 1989. The average price of category 97 products imported from China in 1993 was only half of the average price of extra EC imports and only around one third of the average price for European products of this type. The combination of China's high share in the European market for category 97 products amounting to 26% (1993) with the very low Chinese prices has led to a disruption of the EC market.

The further growth of Chinese exports to the Community, in combination with the generally shrinking EC market, would have economic and social consequences which are no longer bearable to our industry. EC production and exports have progressively decreased in the past years, leading to considerable losses in employment.

Further detailed information on the economic situation in this sector is given in the annex.

In view of this serious economic situation of the European industry and in order to avoid further deterioration of this situation, the Community has to request the opening of consultations according to Art. 6 of the bilateral Agreement on Textiles.
