With reference to article A paragraph 4 of the ARRANGEMENT REGARDING INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN TEXTILES (hereinafter referred to as the ARRANGEMENT) as extended I have the honour to transmit to you herewith copies of notes dated 22 September 1981 exchanged by Austria and India, by which the bilateral agreement between Austria and India of 14 and 20 June 1978 was prolonged.

As a result of the consultations between representatives of Austria and India, which took place on 22 September 1981 in Geneva, and in view of the fact that the negotiations on a further extension of the ARRANGEMENT have not yet been concluded, Austria and India have reached an understanding to prolong the above mentioned bilateral agreement, which will be due to expire on 31 December 1981, for a one-year term.

The export levels in kilograms for the twelve-month period beginning on 1 January 1982 will be as follows:
