
In connection with the European Economic Community's Agreement on trade in textile products with Egypt negotiated under Article 4 of the Arrangement and signed on 24 November 1980, I have to inform you of the following:

During the course of 1981, imports of T-shirts (Category 4) from Egypt into the French and Irish regions of the Community exceeded 102.000 and 6.000p. respectively, being the levels at which the Community can ask for consultations with a view to establishing a limit in respect of the regions of the Community concerned under the provisions of Article 6 of the Agreement. The Community having deemed that there was real risk of market disruption in this case, the two sides consulted on 15 April 1982 in pursuance of Article 12 of the Agreement. As a result of these consultations, and in conformity with the provisions of the Agreement, Egypt agreed to limit exports to France and Ireland as follows:

These new limits contained in the agreed minute annexed to this letter are herewith communicated under Article 4, Paragraph 4 of the Arrangement, as a modification to the Community's Agreement with Egypt.

Delegations of the Arab Rapublic of Egypt and of the European Economic Community ration 19 Fabruary and 15 April 1932 in Brussels for consultations in accordance with Article 12 of the Agreement on trade in textiles between the Community and Egypt signed on 24 November 1980.

As a result of these consultations, Egypt agreed to limit its exports of T-shirts (Category 4, NIMEXE positions 60.04-19;23;71;79) to France and Ireland to the following levels:-

France

1932 : 550.000 pieces

Exceptionnally, for the year 1932 a supplementary quantity of 120.000 pieces has been agreed, to take into account existing contracts.

Ireland

1932 : 60.000 pieces

It is the understanding of both parties that the provisions of the 'Agreement which concern exports of products subject to quantitative limits established in Annex II, in particular the licence procedures set out in Protocol A, shall apply to exports of the above-mentioned products from Egypt to Frince and Ireland from 1 May 1982. The Member states' authorities shall accept any shipment within the quota established for 1932, leaving Egypt without export licences before 1 May 1982. The Egyptian authorities will take the necessary measures to ensure that the restraint lavels established for the year 1932 will not be exceeded, i.e. take into account all shipments that leave or have left Egypt as from 1 January 1932.
