PERU: COTTON DUCK, CATEGORY 319

I. PRODUCT DESCRIPTION

- A. CATEGORY 319 COVERS ALL TYPES OF COTTON DUCK INCLUDING NUMBER DUCK, FLAT ALSO KNOWN AS OUNCE DUCK, AND ARMY DUCK. THE FLAT OR CUNCE DUCKS ALWAYS HAVE SINGLE WARP YARNS WOVEN IN PAIRS: THEY MAY HAVE SINGLE
- OP PLY FILLING YARN. THE IMPORTS FROM PERU ARE LARGELY FLAT OR OUNCE DUCKS, WITH SINGLE FILLING YARNS.
 - -- B. THE TYPE DUCKS IMPORTED FROM PERU ARE TYPICALLY USED FOR COATED FABRICS AND SHOE LININGS.
 - II. U.S. IMPORTS FROM PERU
 - PERU IS THE SECOND LARGEST SUPPLIER OF CATEGORY 319. IT ACCOUNTED FOR 22.6 PERCENT OF THE 1983 TOTAL U.S. IMPORTS. IT IS THE LARGEST SUPPLIER OF SINGLE FILLING YARN DUCK, TSUSA NCS. 327.-21 AND 327.-22. ABOUT 61 PERCENT OF THE TOTAL PERUVIAN CATEGORY 319 IMPORTS WERE FINTERED IN TSUSA NO. 327.-61 WHICH WEIGHS UNDER 7 1/2 OUNCES PER SQUARE YARD AND 25 PERCENT UNDER TSUSA NO. 327.-22, 7 1/2 OUNCES AND HEAVIER.
- PERU'S IMPORTANCE AS A SUPILIED INCREASE SIGNIFICANTLY DURING 1983. IMPORTS FROM PERU WEFE UP 4.2 MILLION SQUARE YARDS DURING THE LAST HALF OF 1983 COMPARED WITH THE FIRST HALF. PERU ACCOUNTED FOR 90 PERCENT OF THE TOTAL INCREASE OF 4.6 MILLION SQUARE YARDS FROM ALL SCURCES DURING THE SECOND HALF OF 1983.

THE MARKET FOR U.S. PRODUCED AND IMPORTED COTTON IUCK PECREASED 40 PERCENT OR 116 MILLION SQUARE YARDS FROM 1972-74 TO 1981-83. THE MARKET FOR U.S. PRODUCED TUCK PROPPED BY 100 MILLION SQUARE YARDS OR 86 PERCENT OF THE TOTAL REDUCTION. THE ABOVE DATA CLEARLY INDICATE THAT THE DOMESTIC PRODUCERS MARKET SHARE SHARPLY EROLED FROM THE 1978-80 PERIOD TO THE 1981-83 PERIOD.

2. IMPORT PENETRATION

ANNEX I PROVIDES DATA ON U.S. PRODUCTION AND IMPORTS FROM 1977 TYROUGH 1983. PRODUCTION IN 1983 WAS 172 MILLION SOUARE YARDS. 23 PERCENT BELOW THE 1977 IEVEL. IMPORTS WERE 76 MILLION SQUARE YARDS, UP 10 PERCENT FROM 1977. THE RATIO OF IMPORTS TO DOMESTIC PROPUCTION ROSE FROM 52.1 PERCENT IN 1977 TO 74.2 PERCENT IN 1983.

3. EMPLOYMENT

TOTAL EMPLOYMENT IN THE INDUSTRY PRODUCING CCTTON DUCK DECLINED FROM AN AVERAGE OF 160.300 EMPLOYEES IN 1977 TO 122,500 IN 1993. PRODUCTION WORKER EMPLOYMENT

DECLINED FROM 144.522 IN 1977 TO 129,222 IN 1983 AND MAN-HOURS WORKED IN THE INDUSTRY DROPPED 24.1 PERCENT OVER THE PERIOD.

4. FOUIPMENT

THEFF HAS PFEN A SUBSTANTIAL DECLINE IN THE NUMBERS OF OPERATING LOOMS ASSIGNED TO COTTON DUCK. AT THE END OF 1977, 2.398 LOOMS WERE OPERATING TO PRODUCE COTTON DUCK, WHEPEAS, AT THE END OF 1983, THE NUMBER OF LOOMS HAD DECLINED TO 1,549, OR PY 35.4 PERCENT OVER THE PERICD.

5. PROFITS

TEXTILE INPUSTRY PROFITS DURING THE FIRST THREE QUARTERS OF 1983 AS A PERCENT OF SALES AVERAGED 3.4 PERCENT COMPARED WITH 3.9 PERCENT FOR ALL MANUFACTURING.

F. SHARP AND SUBSTANTIAL INCREASE IN IMPORTS

1. IMPORTS

U.S. IMPORIS FROM ALL SOURCES INCREASED 12 PERCENT IN 1983 TO 75.9 MILLION SQUARE YARDS COMPARED WITH 67.6 MILLION A YEAR EARLIER. IMPORTS FROM PERU INCREASED 54 PERCENT FROM 11.1 MILLION SQUARE YARDS IN 1982 TO 17.1 MILLION IN 1983.

2. FOUITY

IMPORTS FROM PERU IN 1983 WERE HIGHER THAN ANY SUPPLIER CTHEF THAN HONG KONG. U.S. IMPORTS FROM HONG KONG WERE SUBJECT TO AN AGREED LIMIT IN 1983. IMPORTS FORM SEVERAL SUPPLIERS SMALLER THAN PERU HAVE AGREEMENTS WHICH PROVIDE SPECIFIC LEVELS OR DESIGNATED CONSULTATION LEVELS WHICH WERE FELOW THE U.S. 1983 IMPORTS FROM PERU.

- IN 1983 THERE WERE SEVERAL FILATERAL TEXTILE AGREEMENTS IN EFFECT COVERING CATEGORY 319.

UNITED STATES PRODUCER PRICES ARE THE AVEFAGE OF TWO CUCTATIONS ON COMPARABLE FARRICS. THESE CUCTATIONS ARE CETAINED FROM THE TRADE, AND ARE IN THE SAME STAGF IN THE COMMERCIAL PROCESS.

IMPORTS FROM PERU OF CATFGORY 319 HAVE DUTY-PAID LETE VALUES THAT ARE SIGNIFICANTLY LOWER THAN THE U.S. FRODUCER PRICE, WHICH IS THE BASIS FOR THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT'S DETERMINATION OF THE EXISTANCE OR THREAT OF MARKET DISPUPTION. THE LIST OF PRICES FROM COUNTRIES OTHER THAT THE UNITED STATES OR PERU THAT IS SHOWN IN PEY (B) IS INFORMATIONAL, BUT NOT ESSENTIAL TO THE CASE WITH PERU.

- -- I HAVE THE HONOR TO REFER TO THE ARRANGEMENT REGARDING INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN TEXTILES. WITH ANNEXES, DONE AT GENEVA ON ELEMBER 20, 1973 AND EXTENDED BY PROTOCOLS ADOPTED RESPECTIVELY ON DECEMBER 17, 1977 AND DECEMBER 22, 1961. AT GENEVA HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS (THE ARRANGE-MENT).
- -- DURING RECENT MONTHS MY GOVERNMENT HAS NOTED A SHARP

INCREASE IN IMPORTS OF COTTON DUCK (CATEGORY 319) FROM PERU. TAFTER CAREFUL REVIEW, MY GOVERNMENT HAS CONCLUDED THAT IMPORTS IN CATEGORY 319 FROM PERU ARE CAUSING MARKET DISRUPTION OR THE THREAT THEREOF INTHE UNITED STATES AND ARE THREATENING TO IMPEDE THE ORDERLY PEVFLOPMENT OF THADE AS CONTEMPLATED UNDER ARTICLE THREE OF THE ARRANGEMENT. A DETAILED FACTUAL STATEMENT OF THE REASONS AND JUSTIFICATION FOR THIS CONCLUSION, WITH CURPENT SUPPORTING DATA, IS APPENDED AS ANNEX A WHICH IS TO BE REGARDED AS AN INTEGRAL PART OF THIS NOTE. ACCORDINGLY, THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES HEREBY REQUESTS CONSULTATIONS WITH THE GOVERNMENT OF PERUYIAN EXPORTS OF COTTON DUCK (CAIEGORY 319) TO THE UNITED STATES.

TO WHICH BOTH THE GOVERNMENT OF PERU AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA ARE PARTIES, IF OUR TWO GOVERNMENTS ARE UNABLE TO AGREE ON A MUTUALLY SATISFACTORY SOLUTION TO TRIS MATTER WITHIN SIXIY DAYS. THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES RESERVES THE RIGHT TO RESTRAIN SUCH IMPORTS PROLUCED IN PERU AND EXPORTED TO THE UNITED STATES DURING THE TWELVE-MONTH PERIOD LEGINNING ON THE DATE OF YOUR RECEIPT OF THIS REQUEST. TO A LEVEL NOT LESS THAN THE LEVEL OF UNITED STATES' IMPORTS FROM PERU TURING THE FIRST THESELVE OF THE MOST RECENT FOURTEEN MORTHS PRECEDING THE MONTH IN AHICH THE REQUEST TO CONSULTATIONS WAS MADE, THAT IS THE PLRICD OF NOVEMBER 1, 19-2 TO OCTOBER 31, 1983, THAT LEVEL IS 15,076,495 SQUARE YARDS
