5. Title: Royal Order Revoking Royal Order No. 57 of 20 December 1934 on Spirits
6. Description of content: The new text eliminates the requirement of a certificate of origin to accompany all transport consignments of spirits with a protected designation, as well as verification of that document at the time of customs clearance.
7. Objective and rationale: The revocation is justified by the requirement of eliminating intracommunity customs inspection by 1 January 1993 and by the need no longer to subject the movement of spirituous beverages with a reserved geographical designation, referred to in Annex II to Regulation (EEC) No. 1576/89, to inspection formalities not explicitly foreseen by that regulation nor imposed by its implementing modalities.
