

Committee on Technical Barriers to TradeNOTIFICATION

5.	Title and number of pages of the notified document: Commodity Act Regulation on Novel Foods (9 pages)
6.	Description of content: Novel foods. The regulation prohibits the trade in novel foods (e.g. genetically modified products), unless an exemption regarding the same has been obtained. Such prohibition is necessary to protect public health. It is recommended that only novel foods which have been tested as regards their safety be allowed onto the market. This is a temporary measure which will be withdrawn as soon as the EC regulation on "novel foods" has been laid down by the Council. The regulation defines the "novel foods" concept in a way similar to that contained in the existing proposal of the Commission.
7.	Objective and rationale: This regulation has been drawn up further to the advice issued by the Health Council which deems prior approval (testing health aspects) to be necessary before a novel food is introduced onto the market. The regulation is backed by the Dutch consumers' organizations, food industry and trade.
