6.	<p>Description of content: These Regulations will introduce measures that encourage efficient use of energy and that make economic sense. They will therefore contribute to the competitiveness of Canada's economy while helping to achieve greenhouse gas limitation targets.</p> <p>The Energy Efficiency Regulations will phase out inefficient equipment from the Canadian market by establishing national minimum energy efficiency performance standards for equipment imported into Canada or traded inter-provincially. The Regulations will establish federal Canadian energy efficiency performance standards that will be harmonized with existing provincial standards. As a result, manufacturers of energy-using products will no longer receive conflicting signals from different jurisdictions about the energy efficiency performance levels that are appropriate for their products.</p>
