5.	Title and number of pages of the notified document: Proposed Amendment to the Medical Devices Regulations
6.	<p>Description of content: Part V of the Medical Devices Regulations provides for the pre-market review of new devices prior to sale in Canada. The Table to Part V lists devices that are considered new devices for the purposes of this Part. Contact lenses designed or represented for prolonged wear were recently removed from the Table. Since extended wear contact lenses have been on the market since the 1970s, the technology has stabilized, and it is no longer necessary to designate these lenses as a new device. However, labelling requirements are necessary to promote safe use of contact lenses.</p> <p>This amendment puts in place specific labelling requirements for all contact lenses, in addition to the general labelling requirements in section 6 of the Medical Devices Regulations.</p>
