5.	Title and number of pages of the notified document: Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards; Lamps, Reflective Devices and Associated Equipment (7 pages)
6.	Description of content: The Administration is proposing an amendment to the Federal Motor Vehicle Standard on Lighting that would permit replaceable lenses on integral beam and replaceable bulb headlamps that incorporate on-board headlamp aimers, provided that such headlamps meet more rigorous environmental tests. The benefit of headlamps with replaceable lenses is that the lens or reflector could be replaced in the event of breakage of either without the present necessity to replace both components if only one is damaged.
7.	Objective and rationale: To afford a further optional means of compliance with the headlamp requirements of Standard No. 108
8.	Relevant documents: 59 FR 59975, 21 November 1994; 49 CFR 571. Will appear in the Federal Register when adopted
9.	Proposed date of adoption and entry into force: The Agency is proposing that the amendments would be effective 30 days after publication of the final rule in the Federal Register
