7.	Objective and rationale: The Regulation, which has become necessary on account of the abolition of other legislation, is a codification of existing requirements on consumer fireworks aimed at protecting the health and safety of the consumer.

9. Proposed date of adoption and entry into force: The Regulation had to be brought into force quickly and without prior notification because in practice unexpected connection problems were found to exist between the Fireworks Decree under the Environmentally Hazardous Substances Act, previously notified and entered into force, and the existing regulations on consumer fireworks on the basis of the Hazardous Substances Act.

This meant that the enforcement of the safety requirements for consumer fireworks suffered a serious setback at the turn of the year, an unacceptable situation from the point of view of public safety and the protection of the health and safety of the consumer.
