1 The symbol (R) is used if an investigation is opened in the context of a review of an existing anti-dumping measure.

2 Provisional measures apply from the date a preliminary determination of dumping is made up to the conclusion of the Canadian International Trade Tribunal's inquiry regarding injury caused to Canadian producers of like goods (maximum 120 days from the preliminary determination date). The percentage represents the estimated margin of dumping of the dumped imports calculated as a percentage of normal value.

3 Either the date of a positive injury finding, in a case of an investigation, or the date of the conclusion of a review of normal values and export prices in cases where there is an existing Canadian International Trade Tribunal finding of injury. The percentage represents the estimated margin of dumping of the dumped imports calculated as a percentage of normal value at the time of the injury finding.

4 The word "Renewal" indicates that an existing undertaking was renewed following a review of the injury question; the word "Amendment" indicates that a technical amendment was made to the undertaking, normally to account for changes in the price or terms contained therein.

5 Trade volume is based on statistical data for the latest available 12-month period prior to initiation, unless it is otherwise specified.

6 The investigation respecting Carbon Steel Plate from Belgium, Brazil, the Czech and Slovak Federal Republic, Denmark, Germany, Romania, the United Kingdom, the United States and Yugoslavia was initiated 24.08.92 and the investigation respecting Hot-Rolled, Heat-Treated Carbon Steel Plate from the same countries was initiated 08.09.92. These two investigations were joined at the time of the preliminary determination (06.01.93) and continued as one investigation. Therefore, these two investigations are reported as one subsequent to the preliminary determination.

7 The trade volume for the carbon steel plate and the hot-rolled, heat-treated carbon steel plate investigation is based on import information available to Revenue Canada for the period 01.10.91 to 30.06.92 except for the United States where the period was 01.01.92 to 30.06.92. The longer period was used for countries other than the United States due to less frequent importations. The reported tonnage includes both heat-treated and non-heat-treated plate.

8 The re-investigation of women's leather and non-leather footwear involves exporters identified subsequent to the last review and low volume exporters (less than 2,000 pairs per year).

9 The trade volume for the cold-rolled carbon steel sheet investigation is based on import information available to Revenue Canada for the period 01.10.91 to 30.06.92 except for the United States where the period was 01.01.92 to 30.06.92. The longer period was used for countries other than the United States due to less frequent importations.

10 The trade volume for the flat hot-rolled carbon steel sheet investigation is based on import information available to Revenue Canada for the period 01.10.91 to 30.06.92 except for the United States where the period was 01.01.92 to 30.06.92. The longer period was used for countries other than the United States due to less frequent importations.

11 Due to the uncertainty surrounding the division of the Czech and Slovak Republic, Revenue Canada included imports of the subject goods from that country as a whole at the time of the preliminary determination. Revenue Canada subsequently determined that there were no importations from the Slovak Republic. Accordingly, the investigation respecting the importation of subject goods from the Slovak Republic was terminated by Revenue Canada on 05.04.93.

12 The trade volume for the tomato paste investigation is based on import information available to Revenue Canada for the period 01.01.92 to 30.06.92.

13 The trade volume for the fibreglass pipe insulation investigation is based on import information available to Revenue Canada for the period 01.10.91 to 31.12.92.

14 The trade volume for the copper and brass pipe fittings investigation is based on import information available to Revenue Canada for the period 01.01.92 to 01.09.92.

15 Cases involving Yugoslavia refer to exports from what is now the Republic of Slovenia and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia.

16 At the time of initiation of this investigation, Statistics Canada data was only available for importations from Yugoslavia as a whole. Therefore, subject plate from mills in what is now the Republic of Slovenia and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia were included in the investigation.

As a result of the investigation leading up to the preliminary determination, Revenue Canada determined that there were no importations of subject goods originating in the Republic of Slovenia. Accordingly, the investigation respecting the subject goods from the Republic of Slovenia was terminated at the time of the preliminary determination.

Note to the Semi-Annual Report Submitted by Canada
under Article 14:4 of the Agreement

Where an investigation is conducted in the context of a review of an existing anti-dumping measure, the date of completion of the review is shown in column 5, but generally it is not possible to state the margin of dumping in this column. This is because the review procedure was initiated to allow Canadian authorities to determine the current normal value of the imported product, in order to determine, in the future, whether imports of the product are dumped. As the margin of dumping is equal to the difference between the export price and the normal value, it is impossible to determine, a priori, the percentage margin of dumping. In addition, Canadian authorities compile statistical data concerning trade volume of the imported product only when reviewing a determination of injury in the context of possible revocation of the anti-dumping measure. As a result, statistical data on trade volume for columns 11, 12 and 13 are not available for certain investigations of existing anti-dumping measures.
