## QUESTIONS CONCERNING THE ANTI-DUMPING LEGISLATION OF SWEDEN<sup>1</sup>

United States

1. Does Section 9 of the Swedish law require preliminary findings of both injury and subsidization prior to the imposition of provisional measures?
2. Section 4.1 refers to the filing of a petition by "the industry affected." Does this mean that an affected industry can file a petition even if it is not producing a like product as required by Article 4.5 of the Code?
3. The Supplement submitted by the Swedish delegation (ADP/1Add.2/Suppl.1) states that the Swedish authorities will choose between "three basic types" of duties, "namely variable duties, ad valorem duties and specific duties". Please explain how these types of duties will operate and under what circumstances a particular type of duty might be appropriate.
