Dear Mr. Chairman:

Pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 4 of Article 4 of the Arrangement Regarding International Trade in Textiles, I am instructed by my government to inform the TSB of further amendment to the bilateral texile agreement, as amended, between the Government of the United States of America and the Government of Haiti. The original agreement was notified and circulated as COM.TEX/SB/145 of 18 June 1976. Prior amendments have been notified and circulated as COM.TEX/SB/166-179-202-235-241-261-and 277.

The original agreement, as amended, runs through December 31, 1978. The primary purpose of the present amendment was to convert equitably the limits and consultation levels in the old agreement, negotiated under the old U.S. category system, to levels consonant with the new U.S. category system adopted with effect from January 1, 1978. The parties have agreed to recognize the "indicative limits" set up in Annex B, which includes specific category limits (SL), designated consultation levels (DL) and those categories subject to the general consultation level set forth in the original agreement and amendments thereto (MCL).

The "indicative limits" will be subject to bilateral reviews and possible modification in March or April 1978. It may also be noted that, for the agreement year beginning January 1, 1977, the United States has assented to requests by Haiti to exceed seven consultation levels. The parties have also agreed to the establishment of two new specific limits to the same agreement year.

Attached is a copy of State Department Press Release No. 562 of December 12, 1977 which sets forth the full texts of the exchange of Notes giving effect to the amendments.

UNITED STATES AND HAITI AMEND TEXTILE AGREEMENT

The United States and Haiti agreed to amend the existing bilateral textile agreement on trade in cotton, wool, and man-made fiber textiles and textile products on November 23, 1977. The texts of the notes follow:

UNITED STATES NOTE

November 23, 1977

His Excellency Georges Salomon Ambassador of Haiti

Excellency:

I have the honor to refer to the Arrangement Regarding International Trade in Textiles done at Geneva on December 20, 1973 (the "Arrangement") and to discussions concerning trade in textiles and textile products between representatives of the Governments of Haiti and the United States of America in Washington from October 3 to 7, 1977. On the basis of these discussions and in accordance with Article 4 of the Arrangement, I have the honor to propose that the Agreement between the United States of America and Haiti Concerning Trade in Cotton, Wool and Man-made Fiber Textiles and Textile Products, of March 23, 1976, as amended (hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement"), be further amended as follows:

1. During the agreement year commencing January 1, 1978, the Government of Haiti will, tentatively, implement the Agreement in accordance with the new category system (Annex A hereto) to be put into effect by the Government of the United States on January 1, 1978 and limit exports of textiles and textile products from Haiti to the United States to the indicative quantities set out in Annex B hereto. Indicative quantities designated as "SL" in Annex B represent specific limits and indicative quantities designated "DCL" or "MCL" in Annex B represent consultation levels. The indicative quantities set out in Annex B are subject to modification in accordance with the procedures set out herein, or as otherwise provided in the Agreement.

- 2. Both Governments agree that indicative quantities will tend to represent fair and appropriate allocations of export restraint levels under the category system presently in use to categories under the system to be implemented beginning January 1, 1978.
- 3. Prior to December 1, 1977, the Government of Raiti

 Will inform the Government of the United States of America of
 what it considers to be appropriate indicative quantities
 for the agreement year beginning January 1, 1978:

Inform the Government of Easti whether or not it agrees
to the indicative quantities proposed by the Government of
Haiti. If necessary, representatives of the two Governments
will meet promptly to discuss differences between the indicative
quantities set under paragraph 1 above and those proposed by
the Government of Haiti. The Government of the United States
of America assures the Government of Haiti that when a quota
for 1977 has been adjusted and is filled either totally or
in part, such trade will be considered for automatic inclusion
in indicative quantities for the agreement year beginning
January 1, 1978 if not questioned by either Government.

4. Concurrently with its proposals under paragraph 3, the Government of Eaiti may also propose increases in indicative quantities for 1978; the United States will promptly respond to such proposals. The Government of Eaiti may also propose increases in indicative quantities during the course of any discussions held pursuant to paragraph 3 above;

the Government of the United States of America will consider such proposals as part of the discussions.

- 5. Both Governments agree to conduct a major joint review of the operation of the new category system during late March or early April 1977; if warranted, appropriate adjustments to the Agreement or its implementation will be made following the joint review.
- 6. The Government of the United States of America will cooperate with the Government of Haiti, particularly with respect to the provision of information to technical specialists concerning operation of the new category system.
- 7. a) For the agreement year beginning January 1, 1977, category 50/51 shall be separated to categories 50 and 51. The Government of the United States of America agrees to the request of the Government of the Republic of Eaiti to exceed certain consultation levels for the agreement year beginning January 1, 1977; accordingly, the Categories set out below shall be subject to the following new consultation levels for that agreement year:

b) The Government of the United States of America agrees to the request of the Government of the Republic of Eaiti to modify certain specific limits for the agreement year beginning January 1, 1977, accordingly, the Categories set out below shall be subject to the following new specific limits for that agreement year:
