Pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 4 of Article 4 of the Arrangement Regarding International Trade in Textiles, I am instructed by my government to inform the Textiles Surveillance Body of the further amendment of the textile agreements between the Government of the United States of America and the Governments of Malaysia, Mexico, Pakistan, 1/Romania, 2/ and Singapore.

The original bilateral agreements and prior amendments have been notified and circulated as follows: for Malaysia, as COM.TEX/SB/358, 401, 490, 529 and 569; for Mexico, as COM.TEX/SB/400; for Pakistan, as COM.TEX/SB/300, 491 and 545; for Romania, as COM.TEX/SB/267, 294, 347, 397 (Part) and 494; and for Singapore, as COM.TEX/SB/399, 400, 464, 495, 528, 567 and 584.

Each of the amendments referred to above provides for increases in consultation levels. These increases are as follows:



I refer to paragraph 6 of the Agreement between the United States and Malaysia relating to Trade in Cotton, Wool, and Man-Made Fiber Textiles and Textile Products, with annexes, effected by exchange of notes May 17 and June 8, 1978, as amended ("the Agreement") and to negotiations between our two Governments held in Geneva July 11-16, 1980.

On behalf of my Government, I have the honor to propose that the consultation level for Category 604 be increased to a level of 3,300,000 square yards equivalent for the 1980 agreement year and that the consultation level for Category 446 be increased to a level of 235,000 square yards equivalent for the 1980 agreement year.
