## DRAFT PROGRAMME FOR WORKSHOP ON TRANSPARENCY

## Note by the Secretariat<sup>1</sup>

- 1. The Secretariat of the World Trade Organization is organizing a special workshop on the transparency provisions of the Agreement on the Application of Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures (SPS Agreement), to be held in Geneva, Switzerland, on Monday, 15 October 2012 and in the morning of Tuesday, 16 October 2012. The workshop will be followed by informal and formal meetings of the SPS Committee, lasting until Friday, 19 October 2012. Representatives of Members, Observers and Observer Organizations are all invited to participate in the transparency workshop as well as the subsequent meeting of the Committee.
- 2. Document G/SPS/GEN/997/Rev.2 contains detailed information on the workshop, the link to the application form as well as the requirements and the deadline for submission of applications. More than 130 applications were received by the deadline of 15 June 2012. The WTO, with the financial assistance of the Doha Development Agenda Global Trust Fund (DDAGTF), will sponsor the participation of approximately 50 government officials from developing country Members and Observers. The Secretariat will select participants to be sponsored from applications received from capital-based officials holding direct responsibilities in the work of either the SPS enquiry point or the national notification authority. Exceptions will be made for candidates from WTO Members that have not yet designated their SPS enquiry point and/or the national notification authority, as well as for WTO Observers, on the basis of evidence that the candidate has, or will have, responsibilities related to SPS notifications.
- 3. The workshop is intended to be a highly interactive, "hands-on" training event focusing in particular on the use of the SPS Information Management System (SPS-IMS) and on the system for the on-line submission of SPS notifications (SPS-NSS).
- 4. The following is the proposed programme of the workshop.
