Revision

- 1. The Secretariat of the World Trade Organization is organizing a special workshop on the transparency provisions of the Agreement on the Application of Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures (SPS Agreement), to be held in Geneva, Switzerland, on Monday, 15 October 2012 and in the morning of Tuesday, 16 October 2012. The workshop will be followed by informal and formal meetings of the SPS Committee, lasting until Friday, 19 October 2012. Representatives of Members, Observers and Observer Organizations are all invited to participate in the transparency workshop as well as the subsequent meeting of the Committee.
- 2. The workshop is intended to be a highly interactive, "hands-on" training event focusing in particular on the use of the SPS Information Management System (SPS-IMS) and on the system for the on-line submission of SPS notifications (SPS-NSS).
- 3. Representatives from the Codex Alimentarius, the World Organization for Animal Health and the International Plant Protection Convention will provide information on their online tools that can be helpful to Members. The workshop will also benefit from the presentation by government officials from Morocco and Costa Rica on their national experience with regards to the submission of SPS notifications through the SPS NSS.
