## IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SPS AGREEMENT – TRADE CONCERNS

Submission by the European Communities at the meeting of 7-8 July 1999

- 1. The SPS Agreement's principle role is in providing a framework of provisions that guarantee transparency, non-discrimination and proportionality in the selection and enforcement of relevant sanitary and phytosanitary measures. The SPS Agreement establishes uniform multilateral requirements and procedures which should protect WTO Members from the threat of unilateral action and from the application of disguised restrictions to trade. SPS measures should serve their intended purpose of protecting public, animal and plant health.
- 2. One of the most important requirements is that SPS measures be based on scientific principles and that they are not maintained without sufficient scientific evidence. Risk assessment as appropriate to the circumstances is required.
- 3. The SPS Agreement emphasizes the need for transparency not only of SPS measures but of the whole regulatory process. The importance all WTO Members attach to transparency is reflected in the specific provisions contained in the SPS Agreement itself. Member's views were clearly expressed under the process that led to the review of the SPS Agreement, concluded at the March 1999 meeting, where steps to address the issue were suggested and the need for greater communication and exchange of information was emphasized.
- 4. Since the inception of the SPS Agreement, the European Communities has demonstrated its willingness in cooperating with other Members where requested. In doing so, it has fully responded to its obligations under Annex B of the SPS Agreement, as well as with the provisions of Article 5.8.
- 5. The European Communities has up to now submitted a number of documents in the framework of the SPS Committee meetings to draw the Committee's attention to notifications which directly or indirectly affect our exports and which in our view constitute an obstacle to trade (*Notifications received*).
- 6. The European Communities has also raised in the SPS Committee measures which significantly affect trade in specific commodities, but which have not been notified under the SPS Agreement (*Trade concerns*).
- 7. The European Communities wishes to draw the attention of the Committee to the most relevant trade issues and SPS notifications which have recently been the object of communications or of comments and are still pending.

8. We strongly believe that all Members should cooperate in promoting and enforcing the efforts of their trading partners to implement the SPS Agreement's provisions and the European Communities must emphasize the need for Members to comply fully with their obligations as set out in Annex B and Article 5.8 of the SPS Agreement.
