WORKSHOP ON RISK ANALYSIS

DRAFT PROGRAMME

*Note by the Secretariat*¹

1. At its 25-26 March meeting, the SPS Committee agreed to use the occasion of the SPS thematic workshop in October to focus on risk analysis, based on the proposal submitted by the United States, in the context of the Fourth Review.

2. On this basis, the Secretariat of the World Trade Organization is organizing a special workshop on risk analysis to be held in Geneva, Switzerland on Monday, 13 October and Tuesday, 14 October 2014. The workshop will be followed by informal and formal meetings of the SPS Committee during the same week. Representatives of Members, Observers and Observer Organizations are all invited to participate in the workshop on 13 and 14 October, as well as the subsequent meetings of the Committee.

3. Documents G/SPS/GEN/997/Rev.4 and G/SPS/GEN/997/Rev.4/Add.1 provided information on the workshop and on the application process. More than 500 applications were received by the deadline of 6 June 2014. The WTO, with the financial assistance of the Doha Development Agenda Global Trust Fund (DDAGTF), will sponsor the participation of approximately 50 government officials from developing country Members and Observers. The Secretariat will select participants to be sponsored among applications from government officials holding direct responsibilities in the SPS area.

4. The workshop will provide a platform for discussion and experience sharing on developments and best practices in the area of SPS-related risk analysis.

5. The following is the proposed programme of the workshop.
