DECLARATION OF THAILAND AS AN AREA FREE FROM PANTOEA STEWARTII SUBSP. STEWARTII

COMMUNICATION FROM THAILAND

The following communication, received on 4 August 2014, is being circulated at the request of the Delegation of <u>Thailand</u>.

- 1. Pursuant to Article 7 of the Agreement on the Application of Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures and paragraph 3(b) of Annex B thereto, Thailand hereby advises WTO Members that during 2007-2010, the Department of Agriculture of Thailand conducted surveillances to determine the establishment of the bacterial disease Stewart's wilt (*Pantoea stewartii* subsp. *stewartii*), causal organism of Stewart's bacterial wilt and leaf blight of corn. The analysis was in accordance with Thailand Agricultural Standard (TAS 9031-2008), titled "Diagnostic Protocols for *Pantoea stewartii* subsp. stewartii Bacterial Wilt of Maize".
- 2. The information has been validated and confirmed that *Pantoea stewartii* is absent in Thailand. Thailand reported the absence of *Pantoea stewartii* under the International Plant Protection Convention ("IPPC") on 3 September 2013, which can be found at https://www.ippc.int/countries/thailand/pest-reports/absence-pantoea-stewartii-subsp-stewartii-thailand.
