PUBLIC CONSULTATION ON DEFINING CRITERIA FOR IDENTIFYING ENDOCRINE DISRUPTORS IN THE CONTEXT OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE EUROPEAN UNION'S PLANT PROTECTION PRODUCT REGULATION AND BIOCIDAL PRODUCTS REGULATION

SUBMISSION BY THE EUROPEAN UNION

The following communication, dated 6 October 2014, is being circulated at the request of the delegation of the <u>European Union</u>.

- 1. The European Union (EU) would like to inform all Members about a public consultation on defining criteria for identifying endocrine disruptors in the context of the implementation of the EU's plant protection product regulation and biocidal products regulation. This consultation, launched on 26 September 2014, is part of the impact assessment process and should provide information relevant to the impact assessment. All interested stakeholders are invited to participate.
- 2. All the necessary information, including instructions on how to submit contributions, is available on the European Commission's (Commission) website under the following link:

- 3. The public consultation will last until 16 January 2015. The usual consultation period of 12 weeks has been extended to allow all stakeholders sufficient time to provide input. Contributions can be provided in any official EU language. Contributions in one of the Commission's working languages (preferably English, or French or German) would be welcome to enable to process answers more swiftly.
- 4. All contributions and contributors' identities will be published on the Commission's website, unless a contributor objects to his or her personal data being published on the grounds that such publication would harm his or her legitimate interests. In this case, the contribution may be published anonymously, or the contribution will not be published and, in principle, its content will not be taken into account. Where responses are provided with a request for confidential treatment, they will in any case be subject to the rules on access to documents.³ The privacy statement linked to this consultation and available on the Commission's website explains in detail how personal data and contributions will be dealt with.
- 5. Once the consultation is closed a feedback report assessing all contributions will be issued. Such a factual, quantitative report shall not prejudge or constitute the announcement of any position on the part of the Commission on the issues covered by the consultation. It will feed into further EU legislative work as appropriate.

Background

- 7. EU legislation on biocidal and plant protection products requires the Commission to "specify scientific criteria for the determination of endocrine-disrupting properties" of chemical substances. Pending adoption of these criteria, interim criteria for identifying endocrine disrupting chemicals apply.
- 8. In this context, the Commission has decided to carry out an impact assessment according to its standard procedures. More information about the context of this initiative is published in the roadmap from mid-June 2014 which sets out the scope of the impact assessment and presents the policy options that are being assessed.
