## **DISEASE STATUS UPDATE**

## COMMUNICATION FROM SWITZERLAND

The following communication, received on 24 June 2015, is being circulated at the request of the Delegation of <u>Switzerland</u>.

- 1. In accordance with Art. 6 of the SPS Agreement, Switzerland would like to communicate updates on its disease status for classical swine fever (CSF) and bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE).
- 2. According to Resolution No. 24<sup>1</sup> and Resolution No. 21<sup>2</sup>, adopted during the 83<sup>rd</sup> General Session of the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE) in May 2015, the Assembly has recognized Switzerland as:
  - being free from classical swine fever (CSF) in accordance with chapter 15.2 of the Terrestrial Code; and
  - having a negligible risk for bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE) in accordance with chapter 11.4 of the Terrestrial Code.
- 3. This resolution was adopted by the World Assembly of Delegates of the OIE on 26 May 2015 and has entered into force on 30 May 2015.
- 4. Switzerland asks WTO Members to act in accordance to Art. 6, paragraph 2 of the SPS Agreement and to lift all restrictions on trade with Switzerland related to both these diseases.
