SPS COMMITTEE THEMATIC SESSION ON PESTICIDE MRLS WTO, CENTRE WILLIAM RAPPARD, GENEVA

PROGRAMME

Further to India's introduction of its document on the application of limits of detection for pesticide residues at the October 2015 SPS Committee meeting¹, the Chairperson suggested that the subject be further explored in a thematic session. He proposed that the Secretariat circulate a draft programme taking into account suggestions submitted by Members.²

The following proposed programme of the thematic session will be discussed at the March meeting.

DRAFT PROGRAMME

1 THE SPS AGREEMENT AND MRLS

Background by the WTO Secretariat: relevant provisions and jurisprudence

2 CODEX APPROACH TO ESTABLISHING MRLS

Relevant activities and work in Codex and scientific bodies such as the Codex Committee on Pesticide Residues (CCPR) and the Joint FAO/WHO Meeting on Pesticide Residues (JMPR).

3 RELEVANT REGIONAL AND BILATERAL WORK ON PESTICIDE RESIDUES

Relevant work in other organizations (for example APEC or the OECD).

4 MEMBERS' EXCHANGE OF EXPERIENCES

This session should include speakers from developed and developing country Members expressing the views of importers and exporters.

Possible topics include:

- a. From importers' perspective
 - Domestic regulatory and legal infrastructures for establishing MRLs
 - Domestic frameworks for risk assessment and risk management where:
 - · no international standard exists
 - an existing international standard is not used
 - Domestic experiences in establishing MRLs
- b. From exporters' perspective
 - Impact on international trade of compliance with default MRLs
 - Difficulties in complying with MRLs
