The difference between SPS and TBT measures



Article 1.4 of the SPS Agreement:
(Article 1 - General Provisions)


"Nothing in this Agreement shall affect the rights of Members under the Agreement on Technical Barriers to Trade with respect to measures not within the scope of this Agreement."



Article 1.5 of the TBT Agreement:

(Article 1 - General Provisions)

"The provisions of this Agreement do not apply to sanitary and phytosanitary measures as defined in Annex A of the Agreement on the Application of Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures."





The <u>definition</u> of an SPS measure



Article 1, General Provisions:

Paragraph 2

"For the purposes of this Agreement, the definitions provided in Annex A shall apply."

Paragraph 3

"The annexes are an integral part of this Agreement."
