Note by the Secretariat¹

Revision

- 1. The Secretariat of the World Trade Organization is organizing a workshop on control, inspection and approval procedures to be held in Geneva, Switzerland on Monday, 9 July and Tuesday, 10 July 2018. The workshop will be followed by informal and formal meetings of the SPS Committee during the same week. Representatives of Members, Observers and Observer Organizations are all invited to participate in the workshop, as well as the subsequent meetings of the Committee from 11 to 13 July 2018.
- 2. Documents G/SPS/GEN/997/Rev.8 and G/SPS/GEN/997/Rev.8/Add.1 provide information on the workshop. The WTO, with the financial assistance of the Doha Development Agenda Global Trust Fund (DDAGTF), is sponsoring the participation of approximately 40 government officials from developing country Members and Observers in the workshop. The Secretariat has selected participants to be sponsored among applications from government officials in charge of the implementation of the SPS Agreement.
- 3. The workshop will provide a forum for discussion and experience sharing on developments, challenges and practices in implementing Article 8 and Annex C of the SPS Agreement on control, inspection and approval procedures. Through presentations, practical case stories and discussions, the workshop will aim to expand Members' understanding of the relevant provisions, jurisprudence, guidance from the international standard-setting bodies, as well as regional and national experiences.
- 4. This revised version of the programme takes into account Members' comments received by 21 May 2018.
