SELF-DECLARATION BY MEXICO AS A COUNTRY HISTORICALLY FREE FROM AFRICAN SWINE FEVER

COMMUNICATION FROM MEXICO

The following communication, received on 20 September 2018, is being circulated at the request of the delegation of Mexico.

- 1. Pursuant to Article 6 of the Agreement on the Application of Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures on the subject of regional conditions, in particular pest- or disease-free areas or areas of low pest or disease prevalence, and in keeping with the principle of transparency, we hereby notify the Self-Declaration by Mexico as a country historically free from African Swine Fever, submitted to the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE) on 19 July 2018. The document is published in Spanish.
- 2. In this Declaration, the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock, Rural Development, Fisheries and Food (SAGARPA), acting through the National Agriculture and Food Health, Safety and Quality Service, reports on (I) the African swine fever situation in Mexico; (II) early detection systems; (III) species susceptible to African swine fever in Mexico; (IV) measures for maintaining ASF-free status; (V) conclusions.
- 3. WTO Members are asked to use this self-declaration as a refence in their commercial dealings with respect to livestock products from Mexico.
- 4. This communication is being submitted for purposes of transparency and in order to provide Members with further information on the current regulatory process in Mexico.
