Addendum

The following communication, dated 7 October 2015, is being circulated at the request of the Delegation of the <u>United States of America</u>.

1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1. In 1999, the SPS Committee initiated a process to gather information on the technical assistance Members have requested, received or provided in support of the implementation of the SPS Agreement since it came into force on 1 January 1995 (see G/SPS/W/101). In response to this interest, the United States (G/SPS/GEN/181 and addenda) and others, including *inter alia* Canada (G/SPS/GEN/1426), the European Union (G/SPS/GEN/1139 and addenda), and Japan (G/SPS/GEN/1160 and addenda), have submitted periodic reporting on technical assistance provided in support of implementation of the SPS Agreement. This submission marks the eleventh such submission by the United States.
- 1.2. This compilation of US technical assistance provided to developing countries and acceding countries in this report covers the period between 1 October 2012 and 30 September 2014. In this report, the United States provides details on 230 technical assistance projects in the fields of food safety, animal health, plant health, and agricultural biotechnology. Forms of assistance include regional trade capacity building workshops and conferences, hands-on training programmes, fellowships and exchanges, and site visits to US research and academic institutions.
- 1.3. The provision of technical assistance to developing countries in support of implementation of the SPS Agreement continues to be important to the United States. US technical assistance programmes assist developing countries, least developed countries, and acceding countries to develop and implement effective, transparent and science-based regulatory systems to protect human, animal and plant health while facilitating trade in these products. These programmes seek to foster a clear understanding of key SPS provisions in international and bilateral trade agreements. The United States continues its efforts to tailor technical assistance in response to requests made by developing countries and acceding countries. In our experience, demand-driven assistance provided within a framework of mutual respect and accountability provides the strongest foundation for delivering enduring results.
- 1.4. The US Department of Agriculture (USDA) implements many of these technical assistance activities in partnership with other US Government agencies, international organizations, US universities, agri-businesses, and private consultants. This report includes a list of the key US Government agencies involved in the provision of technical assistance to developing countries, least developed countries, and acceding countries, as well as a list of representative activities conducted in the specified reporting period. The lists are not exhaustive.

2 KEY US AGENCIES INVOLVED IN PROVIDING TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

- 2.1. **Animal Plant and Health Inspection Service (APHIS)** APHIS is a lead US government agency in international SPS standard setting organization activities. APHIS international technical and regulatory capacity building activities are conducted on the basis of requests from other countries or from US Government agencies involved in international technical assistance. APHIS has staff positioned globally in 34 overseas offices assisting in both import and export issues. APHIS partners with international agricultural organizations, such as the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE), the Food and Agricultural Organization of the UN (FAO), and the Inter-American Institute for Cooperation in Agriculture (IICA) to achieve advance science-based SPS objectives globally.
- 2.2. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) EPA works closely with FAS and other US agencies to provide scientific and policy expertise for the establishment of standards and requirements regarding sound pesticide and chemical management practices based on science. EPA, considered one of the world's leading authorities on the regulation of pesticides, has worked extensively with other countries both bilaterally and through international fora to promote harmonized maximum residue limits.
- 2.3. **Food and Drug Administration (FDA)** FDA is the agency within the Department of Health and Human Services responsible for protecting the public health by assuring the safety, efficacy and security of domestically produced and imported foods, as well as human and veterinary drugs, food additives, and supplements. FDA maintains an international presence and works with many other US agencies to provide public health and food safety technical expertise to our trading partners.
- 2.4. Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) FSIS is the USDA's public health agency, responsible for ensuring that the nation's commercial supply of meat, poultry, and egg products is safe, wholesome, and correctly labeled and packaged. FSIS has significant expertise in helping foreign governments understand the regulatory system of the United States.
- 2.5. **Foreign Agricultural Service (FAS)** FAS has the primary responsibility for coordinating and implementing USDA's international trade policy, promotion, and capacity building activities. FAS provides technical assistance through fellowships and scientific exchange programs, such as the Cochran and Borlaug fellowship programmes, as well as through the dispatch of USDA advisors and experts from other US food regulatory agencies to assist foreign policymakers, regulators, scientists, and the private sector to address complex, trade-related issues such as SPS compliance and applications of agricultural biotechnology.
- 2.6. **US Agency for International Development (USAID)** USAID is the lead US Government agency delivering development assistance worldwide. USAID provides assistance to support country, regional and global strategies that facilitate trade and strengthen SPS systems. Technical assistance builds the capacity needed to support policy and systems change enabling implementation of the WTO SPS Agreement and to meet regional and international SPS standards.
