## IMPLEMENTATION OF ARTICLE 8 AND ANNEX C OF THE AGREEMENT ON SANITARY AND PHYTOSANITARY MEASURES EXPERIENCES AND APPROACHES RELATING TO INSPECTION

## COMMUNICATION FROM CANADA

The following communication, received on 9 October 2020, is being circulated at the request of the Delegation of <u>Canada</u>.

- 1. The Fifth Review of the Operation and Implementation of the SPS Agreement (G/SPS/64) includes a recommendation that the Committee establish a formal SPS Committee agenda item on Annex C under the Operation and Implementation of the SPS Agreement agenda item to enable Members to share information and continue discussions and information exchange on the topic of control, inspection and approval procedures.
- 2. In this vein, Canada would like to share information concerning resources that are available regarding the Canadian Food Inspection Agency's (CFIA) recent experiences and approaches to inspection.
- 3. In recent years, CFIA identified consistent and efficient inspections as one of its strategic priorities. - 4. Canada would also like to highlight specific information that is available regarding CFIA's inspection initiatives.
  - a. CFIA's Standard Inspection Procedure (SIP) outlines a common inspection approach that will apply a consistent method of inspection for all regulated commodities: plant, animal and food. It describes how an inspection is conducted, and provides inspectors with the flexibility to adapt to different situations that may arise during an inspection.
