SPS COMMITTEE THEMATIC SESSION ON TRADE FACILITATIVE APPROACHES TO PESTICIDE MRLS, INCLUDING SUBSTANCES NOT APPROVED FOR USE IN AN IMPORT MARKET

PROGRAMME

The SPS Committee agreed, at its November 2021 meeting, to hold a thematic session on Trade Facilitative Approaches to Pesticide MRLs in the margins of its March 2022 Committee meeting, based on a proposal submitted by Australia, Colombia, Paraguay, and the United States.¹

The thematic session will explore different approaches used by Members to address various issues associated with pesticide maximum residue limits (MRLs) and provide an opportunity for Members to share their experiences and best practices with regard to facilitating safe trade. Trade facilitative approaches may include harmonizing with Codex MRLs, including as a default, and establishing import tolerances, and Members have a variety of tools at their disposal to help develop least restrictive approaches to pesticide MRLs in agricultural trade. The thematic session will build off of recent work by the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) in this area and provide Members an opportunity to learn from one another and from key private sector perspectives, including those involving transition periods and channels of trade.

The thematic session will be held in Geneva, Switzerland, on Tuesday, 22 March 2022, beginning at $\underline{10:00}$ (CET), and continuing in the afternoon at $\underline{15:00}$ (CET), as necessary. The thematic session can be attended in person² or virtually through the Interprety platform. Interpretation will be provided in English, French, and Spanish.
