#### SPECIFIC TRADE CONCERNS

Note by the Secretariat<sup>1</sup>

Revision

#### PART 1

At the 15-16 March 2000 meeting of the SPS Committee, the Secretariat was requested to prepare a paper summarizing the specific trade concerns that had been brought to the Committee's attention since 1995.<sup>2</sup> The Secretariat has revised this document to include new information provided by Members (G/SPS/GEN/204/Rev.1, Rev.2, Rev.3 and Rev.4). At its 17-18 March 2004 meeting, the SPS Committee requested that the fifth revision of the G/SPS/GEN/204 be re-organized into several parts to facilitate information retrieval and document circulation.<sup>3</sup>

The fifth revision of G/SPS/GEN/204 is divided into 4 parts.

Part 1 (G/SPS/GEN/204/Rev.5) of the document contains summary statistics and graphs for all the trade concerns raised in the SPS Committee between 1995 and 2004. The trade concerns are categorized as relating to food safety, animal or plant health. Summary tables of specific trade concerns raised by Members from 1995 to 2004 are also included.

Part 2 (G/SPS/GEN/204/Rev.5/Add.1) of the document contains information regarding all issues which were raised in the SPS Committee for the first time in 2004, including issues which were previously raised but on which further discussions or activities occurred during 2004. This includes issues for which there was no substantive discussion in the Committee during 2004, but where Members reported that a previously raised issue had been resolved, or where substantive action on the issue occurred in another WTO body during 2004 (e.g., establishment of a dispute resolution panel on the issue).

Part 3 (G/SPS/GEN/204/Rev.5/Add.2) of the document contains information regarding all issues which were raised in the SPS Committee between 1995 and 2004, and on which no further discussion or activities occurred during 2004.

Part 4 (G/SPS/GEN/204/Rev.5/Add.3) of the document contains information regarding all issues which were raised in the SPS Committee between 1995 and 2004, and on which a resolution was reported prior to 2004.




FIGURE 2A – TRADE CONCERNS BY SUBJECT

Altogether, 204 specific trade concerns were raised in the ten years between 1995 and 2004. Figure 1 shows the number of new concerns raised each year with 21 new concerns raised in 2004. Figure 2a categorizes the trade concerns raised over the ten years into food safety, animal or plant health issues. Overall, 27 per cent of trade concerns relate to food safety concerns, 29 per cent relate to plant health, and 4 per cent concern other issues such as certification requirements or translation. Forty per cent of concerns raised relate to animal health and zoonoses. The animal health and zoonoses category is further divided into foot-and-mouth disease (FMD), other animal health concerns and transmissible spongiform encephalopathy (TSEs). Figure 2b shows that TSEs account for 40 per cent of animal health concerns, while issues related to foot-and-mouth disease account for 25 per cent. The remaining 35 per cent relate to other animal health concerns such as avian influenza.

FIGURE 1 – NUMBER OF NEW ISSUES RAISED






FIGURE 2B – TRADE CONCERNS RELATED TO ANIMAL HEALTH & ZOONOSES



Developing countries are participating actively under this agenda item in the SPS Committee meetings. Figure 3a indicates that over the ten years, developing country Members have raised 101 trade concerns (on many occasions more than one Member has raised, supported or maintained an issue) compared to 143 raised by developed country Members and two raised by least-developed country Members. In 149 cases, a developing country Member has supported another Member raising an issue, compared to 99 for developed country Members and zero for least-developed country Members. In 124 cases, the measure at issue was maintained by a developed country Member, and in 99 cases it was maintained by a developing country Member. No trade concerns regarding measures maintained by least-developed country Members have been raised. Figure 3b shows the number of developing country Members raising new issues for each year.

FIGURE 3B – NUMBER OF DEVELOPING COUNTRY MEMBERS RAISING NEW ISSUES





Figure 4 indicates that 56 trade concerns have been reported solved out of the 204 trade concerns raised over the ten years. Fifteen trade concerns have been reported partially solved. In these instances, trade may have been allowed for selected products or by some of the importing Members maintaining the measure in question. No solutions have been reported for the remaining 133 trade concerns. Excluding the 21 new issues raised in 2004, there are 116 trade concerns that are at least a year old and for which no solution have been reported. However, some of these concerns may have been solved without the Committee being aware of these developments.
