SPS COMMITTEE THEMATIC WORKSHOP ON TRANSPARENCY MONDAY, 18 MARCH AND TUESDAY, 19 MARCH 2024 WTO, CENTRE WILLIAM RAPPARD, GENEVA

PROGRAMME

Note by the Secretariat1

- 1. As decided by the SPS Committee at its November 2023 meeting, the Secretariat of the World Trade Organization will organize a workshop on the transparency provisions of the Agreement on the Application of Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures (SPS Agreement), on 18-19 March 2024. The workshop will be followed by informal and formal meetings of the SPS Committee, lasting until Friday, 22 March 2024. Representatives of Members, Observers and Observer Organizations are all invited to participate in the transparency workshop as well as the subsequent meetings of the SPS Committee. The workshop can be attended in-person or virtually via Zoom. Interpretation will be provided in English, French and Spanish.
- 2. The March 2024 workshop builds on the successful <u>June 2022 SPS Workshop on Transparency</u> which had provided the Committee with an introduction to the main functions of the <u>ePing SPS&TBT Platform</u>, launched in July 2022, which integrates SPS and TBT online transparency tools.
- 3. The workshop aims to enhance the implementation of SPS transparency provisions by bringing together officials from WTO Members and Observers to engage in a technical discussion on SPS transparency-related work, and to exchange experiences on the use of online transparency tools, including the ePing_SPS&TBT_Platform. The workshop, open to participation by all delegates from WTO Members and Observers attending the March 2024 SPS Committee meeting, will be of particular interest to government officials in charge of the implementation of the transparency provisions of the SPS Agreement, i.e. SPS national notification authorities and enquiry points.
- 4. The WTO Secretariat, with the financial assistance of the Doha Development Agenda Global Trust Fund (DDAGTF), will sponsor the participation of 30 government officials in this workshop. The Governments of Members and Observers to the WTO, which are eligible to benefit from training and technical cooperation activities, are invited to present one or two officials for consideration in the selection process. In this regard, an invitation letter with the application form will be distributed to eligible technical assistance beneficiaries through their WTO representation.
- 5. Additionally, the WTO Secretariat will be in a position to provide funding for five government officials from eligible technical assistance beneficiaries, to participate as speakers in this workshop.² Participants or speakers wishing to extend their stay in Geneva for the informal and formal SPS Committee meetings from 20 to 22 March 2024, would be welcome to do so on a self-funded basis.
- 6. Members are invited to submit comments on this draft programme and suggest speakers as soon as possible and at the latest by **Friday, 19 January 2024**. The Secretariat will circulate a revised version of the programme after taking into consideration the comments received.
