Revision

- 1. As decided by the SPS Committee at its November 2023 meeting, the Secretariat of the World Trade Organization will organize a workshop on the transparency provisions of the Agreement on the Application of Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures (SPS Agreement), on 18-19 March 2024. The workshop will be followed by informal and formal meetings of the SPS Committee, lasting until Friday, 22 March 2024. The workshop, open to participation by WTO Members and Observers, will be of particular interest to government officials in charge of the implementation of the transparency provisions of the SPS Agreement, i.e. SPS national notification authorities (NNAs) and enquiry points (NEPs).
- 2. The workshop aims to enhance the implementation of SPS transparency provisions by bringing together officials to engage in a technical discussion on SPS transparency-related work, and to exchange experiences on the use of online transparency tools, including the ePing_SPS&TBT Platform. It builds on the successful June 2022 SPS Workshop on Transparency which had provided the Committee with an introduction to the main functions of the ePing_SPS&TBT Platform, launched in July 2022, which integrates SPS and TBT online transparency tools.
- 3. The workshop will be held in Geneva, Switzerland, beginning on Monday, 18 March at 15:00 (CET) for all interested delegates, and continuing on Tuesday, 19 March at 10:00 (CET). The workshop can be attended in person or virtually via Zoom. Interpretation will be provided in English, French and Spanish. Additional training will be held for SPS NNAs and NEPs (in person only), as indicated in the programme.
- 4. Members are invited to submit comments on this draft programme as soon as possible and at the latest by **Friday, 1 March 2024**. The Secretariat will circulate a final programme after taking into consideration the comments received.
