# ACTIONS AIMED AT THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE WTO AGREEMENT ON THE APPLICATION OF SANITARY AND PHYTOSANITARY MEASURES (SPS AGREEMENT)

<u>Information Submitted by the Inter-American Institute for</u>
<u>Cooperation on Agriculture (IICA)</u>

The following communication, dated 10 March 2004, is circulated at the request of the Inter-American Institute for Cooperation on Agriculture.

1. The observer organizations of the WTO Committee on Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures (SPS Committee) are invited to submit reports on activities they have carried out to contribute to the understanding and implementation of the SPS Agreement. Below are some of the initiatives that the IICA has undertaken, or will undertake in the near future, in pursuit of this objective.

#### Support for the active participation of the countries of the Americas in the SPS Committee

2. In conjunction with the United States Department of Agriculture and in cooperation with other countries, the IICA continues to implement measures aimed at reinforcing the active participation of Latin American and Caribbean Countries in the SPS Committee. Among the main results of this activity is the continued strengthening in those countries of the institutional base for the administration and implementation of the SPS Agreement. The creation or strengthening of formal or informal national coordination committees is contributing to the sustainability of active participation by the countries in the SPS Committee (further information can be obtained from Eric Bolaños at erick.bolanos@iica.ac.cr, or Marianne McElroy at marianne.mcelroy@fas.usda.gov).

#### Actions directed at the Caribbean region

- 3. Through the Strengthening Agricultural Quarantine Services (SAQS) project:
  - (i) In Belize, a regional workshop known as Risk Analysis for Animal Health has been organized. This activity has involved the production of synchronized procedural manuals and the training of quarantine staff in risk analysis. Participants provided feedback on the manual prepared by the international consultant and provided input for the preparation of a final version.
  - (ii) In Trinidad and Tobago, a regional workshop was organized on the subject of plant quarantine. Training was provided in the application of harmonized quarantine procedures and pest and disease surveillance systems, as well as certification and inspection procedures. The work was conducted using a training CD-ROM on the subject. A further workshop was organized on accreditation of private and professional animal health laboratories in Trinidad and Tobago.

- (iii) A regional workshop was held in Guyana on inspection and certification of live animals and animal products and bi-products. As in the case of other workshops, the work was carried out on the basis of a CD-ROM specially produced by the consultant.
- (iv) A regional workshop was held in St. Vincent and the Grenadines on the accreditation of private professionals in the field of plant health. This activity focused on the regulation of programmes that were being developed so as to enable private professionals to perform certain functions under the supervision of the Government. #### **Training in HACCP**

4. The IICA has maintained its training programme in the HAACP through video conferencing, face-to-face courses and the use of CD-ROMs. The strategy has been directed towards training instructors in order to enhance the course's outreach while at the same time maintaining special programmes for the private sector. The beneficiary countries have included Costa Rica, the Dominican Republic, Guatemala, Panama, Nicaragua, Peru and Mexico.
