UPDATE ON THE OPERATION OF THE STANDARDS AND TRADE DEVELOPMENT FACILITY

Note by the Secretariat¹

Overview

1. The Standards and Trade Development Facility (STDF) is a global programme in capacity building and technical co-operation established by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE), the World Bank, the World Health Organization (WHO) and the World Trade Organization (WTO). It assists developing countries to comply with food safety, animal and plant health (sanitary and phytosanitary or SPS) measures in international trade. Other international organizations, donors and developing countries also participate.

2. The STDF has two main aims:

- to assist developing countries enhance their expertise and capacity to analyze and to implement international sanitary and phytosanitary (SPS) standards, improving their human, animal and plant health situation, and thus ability to gain and maintain market access; and
- to act as a vehicle for co-ordination among technical co-operation providers, the mobilization of funds, the exchange of experience and the dissemination of good practice in relation to the provision and receipt of SPS-related technical co-operation.
- 3. Applications for STDF funding may be made at any point in the year but should be received 45 days prior to each Working Group meeting to be considered at that time. Forthcoming deadlines for the submission of project proposals are 25 April and 2 September for the Working Group meetings on 27 June and 17 October 2008. Operating Plan for 2008-09

4. An Operating Plan for 2008-09 was adopted by the Policy Committee in November 2007. The operating plan focuses on four main thematic areas: (i) coordination; (ii) project development; and (iii) project implementation and iv) dissemination of results. Greater emphasis is placed on the STDF acting as a forum for information exchange and coordination in the supply and receipt of SPS-related technical cooperation. The Operating Plan includes a budget based on the target level of donor funding of US\$5 million agreed as part of the STDF Medium Term Strategy (2007-2011).

Coordination

- 5. On 15-17 November 2007, the UN Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO) and the World Bank organized a workshop to examine issues related to investment in laboratory infrastructure in developing countries which provide services for food safety and agricultural health. A total of 40 participants attended the meeting about a third of whom were resource persons from developing countries in Asia, Africa and the Americas. The meeting was also attended by a number of delegates to the SPS Committee, officials from EU regulatory agencies, private lab operators and donor agencies. The immediate purpose of the workshop was to provide input for the finalization of a guide being jointly developed by the World Bank and UNIDO to assist in assessing and making investment decisions in laboratory infrastructure. More details on this event can be found in document G/SPS/GEN/823.
- 6. Further thematic events on different aspects of SPS-related technical assistance are planned in 2008. A workshop on SPS capacity evaluation tools will take place in Geneva on 31 March 2008. A variety of SPS capacity evaluation tools have been developed: (i) specific tools (e.g. looking exclusively at a particular thematic area, for example plant health), (ii) generic tools (which look at the SPS system as a whole) and (iii) related tools which treat one aspect of the SPS area in a more general setting (e.g. the interface between food safety, health and trade). This workshop will provide an opportunity for the Committee to discuss these tools, Members' experience of their use, scope for collaboration between international organizations in their further development, and the sharing of results. An overview of the capacity evaluation tools to be discussed can be found in document G/SPS/GEN/821.
- 7. The STDF is collaborating with the Organization of Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) in research on good practice in the area of SPS-related technical cooperation. To this end, a request for information was circulated to the SPS Committee on 18 January 2008 in document G/SPS/GEN/816. The request was addressed to donors willing to share good practice on SPS-related technical co-operation in three regions: Central America, East Africa and the Greater Mekong Delta Sub-region. The deadline for the submission of information was 28 February 2008. Table 1 below sets out the replies received to date. Results of this research will be presented at a joint STDF-OECD workshop on good practice in SPS-related technical cooperation. This workshop is tentatively scheduled to be held back-to-back with the SPS Committee meeting in October 2008.

- 8. In October 2006, the Secretariat issued an analysis of data reported on SPS-related technical assistance to the WTO OECD Trade Capacity Building Database (TCBDB) and a parallel database established with funding from the STDF (G/SPS/GEN/726). The objective of this work is to identify as accurately and completely as possible SPS-related technical assistance flows. SPS information reproduced in the TCBDB has had to be supplemented from other sources. For example, the total value of SPS-related assistance reported world-wide in the TCBDB was US\$280 million for the period 2001-2006. Additional research put this figure much higher, at approximately US\$1,093 million for the same period. However, even this higher figure is an under-estimation. The Secretariat is continuing to examine the way to collect the most complete data set. These efforts have been complicated by the decision to give pre-eminence to the OECD's Credit Reporting System in tracking of development assistance flows and to discontinue reporting within a dedicated SPS code for trade policy regulation. The Secretariat is examining the best way to proceed in this regard, with a view to issuing an update to document G/SPS/GEN/726.
- 9. In parallel, work has started on the development of a compendium of technical assistance in the SPS area. A request will be circulated through the SPS Committee and the STDF to gather information for this document. It is hoped that a first draft of the compendium should be available for the October meeting of the SPS Committee.
- 10. The STDF has also been working closely with the Aid for Trade initiative. Workshops on the supply of and demand for SPS-related technical assistance were organized in Lima (12 September 2007), Manila (18 September 2007) and Dar es Salaam (30 September 2007) as part of the Regional Reviews of Aid for Trade held in 2007. (G/SPS/GEN/812 provides further information.)
- 11. A second phase of these Aid for Trade activities is now underway. This includes work with beneficiaries to devise balance sheets of SPS needs and assistance, with a view to identifying priority needs not addressed through on-going or planned assistance and to mobilize technical co-operation funds to address these needs on a priority basis. Related fieldwork has been on-going in Central America, East Africa and the Mekong Delta since January. The results of this research will be presented at three workshops in each region in May and June 2008. These activities are scheduled as follows:

- 21-22 May in Phnom Penh, Cambodia;
- 28-29 May in Kampala, Uganda; and
- 10-12 June in Guatemala.
- 12. Results from these three SPS Aid for Trade activities will be evaluated at the STDF Working Group meeting in June 2008. If the outcome is deemed positive, further research work will be planned in additional regions in 2008-2009.

Project development

- 13. Project preparation grants (PPGs) are a key mechanism for future STDF programme development. PPGs are designed to turn good ideas into projects. As such, they can help overcome constraints faced by developing countries in the articulation of their needs. To date, a total of 25 PPGs have been approved.
- 14. Project preparation grants are also a mechanism for ensuring synergy with other on-going initiatives. For example, they can support project development for priority actions in the SPS area which have been identified in Diagnostic Trade Integration Studies (DTIS) conducted through the Enhanced Integrated Framework programme (EIF).
- 15. The main criterion in awarding preparation grants is the likelihood that the project developed may receive funding. Final project funding may be provided by the STDF or from another funding source, e.g. a bilateral donor. Much greater emphasis is being placed on the use of PPGs to provide a basis for donor interventions and as a vehicle for mobilizing funds for projects developed by the STDF.

Project funding

- 16. The STDF funds technical cooperation activities which:
 - address underlying issues of SPS capacity building in beneficiary countries (in particular in low income countries, or on a regional basis), ideally through innovative, preventative and / or pilot projects which may be replicated by other donors; and
 - which aim to address gaps in SPS information, training materials or which aim to improve coordination among SPS technical co-operation providers through collaborative projects.
- 17. Information on how to apply, eligibility criteria and application forms can be found in the STDF Operational Rules. A target of 12 projects to be funded through the STDF has been set in the Operating Plan for 2008-09.
- 18. Independent evaluations of three STDF projects were completed in 2007. The projects evaluated were:
 - <u>STDF 14</u>: Development of the OIE capacity evaluation tool (Performance, Vision, Strategy) in collaboration with IICA.
 - <u>STDF 37</u>: Assistance to developing countries in the implementation of ISPM No. 15 (Guidelines for regulating wood packaging material in international trade).
 - <u>STDF 56</u>: Capacity building for implementation of the Codex Alimentarius Code of Good Practice for Animal Feeding.

19. The total number of projects and PPGs approved by the STDF currently stands at 27 projects and 25 PPGs. Annex 1 provides an overview of the implementation status of all STDF projects and PPGs. Documents and reports pertaining to completed, ongoing and approved STDF projects can be accessed on the STDF website.

Information dissemination

- 20. Enhancement of the STDF web site is in progress. An initial update was carried out in December 2007 when the site was transferred from the World Bank to the WTO. Further work needs to be undertaken to improve the site's content and functionality, particularly in French and Spanish. A Fact Sheet on the STDF was published at the beginning of March 2008 and the first issue of a triannual STDF newsletter will be distributed before the end of March 2008.
- 21. Discussions are also on-going on the development of a short information film. This film would serve as a training tool to increase awareness among policy and decision-makers about the importance of SPS capacity for human health, economic development, and international trade.
