# WTO SPS TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE ACTIVITIES IN 2014: GENERAL INFORMATION, SELECTION PROCESS AND APPLICATION FORM

## 1 THEMATIC SPS WORKSHOP

- 1. At its 25-26 March meeting, the SPS Committee agreed to use the occasion of the SPS thematic workshop in October to focus on risk analysis, based on the proposal submitted by the United States, in the context of the Fourth Review. This SPS thematic workshop on risk analysis will take place on Monday, 13 and Tuesday, 14 October 2014. The SPS informal and regular meetings will be held on 15-17 October 2014.
- 2. The objective of the workshop is to bring together officials responsible for participation in and implementation of the SPS Agreement, the FAO/WHO Codex Alimentarius Commission (Codex), the International Plant Protection Convention (IPPC), and the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE) for an in depth discussion, at a technical level, on decision making and communication during the risk analysis process. More specifically:
  - a. Participants will review relevant developments in SPS-related risk analysis since the SPS workshop in 2000 (G/SPS/GEN/209).<sup>2</sup> This will include information from the Codex, IPPC and OIE on their respective work, as well as a review of the outcome of WTO dispute settlement cases as they relate to the risk assessment provisions of the SPS Agreement.
  - b. Participants will discuss the link between risk assessment outcomes and risk management decisions, including sharing their experiences in using risk assessment as a basis for making SPS-related risk management decisions, and their experiences in co-operation between the public and private sectors.
  - c. Participants will discuss their experiences in SPS-related risk communication.
  - d. Participants will explore ways to leverage resources to more effectively perform risk assessments, as well as emerging issues and challenges in risk analysis.

## 2 REGIONAL SPS WORKSHOPS

- 3. Three regional workshops on the SPS Agreement will be organized in 2014, with **revised dates** and venues, and application deadlines as follows:
  - Regional SPS Workshop for Central and Eastern Europe, Central Asia and the Caucus.

- Regional SPS Workshop for the Pacific (co-organized with the Pacific Islands Forum Secretariat). Nadi, Fiji, the week of 10 November 2014. Application deadline: 18 July 2014;
- Regional SPS Workshop for Latin America (co-organized with the Inter-American Development Bank). Montevideo, Uruguay, week of 17 November 2014. Application deadline: 15 August 2014.

The Secretariat will select a maximum of thirty participants for the Regional SPS Workshop for Central and Eastern Europe, Central Asia and the Caucus, as well as for the Regional SPS Workshop for the Pacific. For the Regional SPS Workshop for Latin America (co-organized with the Inter-American Development Bank), two government officials will be selected from each eligible country.
- 5. The targeted audience for these workshops are government officials:
  - a. holding direct responsibilities in the SPS area, i.e. SPS notification authority or enquiry point; Codex, IPPC or OIE contact points; officials from a relevant Ministry in charge of coordinating SPS matters and international trade; and
  - b. possessing a proven intermediate level of understanding of the principles and structure of the WTO, and of the principles and provisions of the SPS Agreement.
