COMMUNICATION FROM MEXICO

The following communication, dated 9 April 2003, has been received from the delegation of Mexico with the request that it be circulated to Members of the Committee.

- 1. Pursuant to paragraph 3 of Annex B of the Agreement on the Application of Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures and Article 10.3.1 of the Agreement on Technical Barriers to Trade, the Government of Mexico hereby reports that the Ministry of the Economy, through the General Directorate of Standards, published the National Standardization Programme for 2003 in Spanish in the *Diario Oficial de la Federación* (Official Journal) on 7 April 2003.
- 2. Under Article 61-A of the Federal Law on Metrology and Standardization, the National Standardization Programme for 2003 includes a list of the issues which are to be developed over the coming year as Mexican official standards ("technical regulations" and "sanitary and phytosanitary measures"), reference standards for government procurement and Mexican standards ("voluntary standards") by the departments and agencies of the Federal Public Administration and registered national standards bodies, respectively.
- 3. In particular, the National Standardization Programme for 2003 covers a total of 4,799 subject areas, 577 of which correspond to Mexican official standards, 4,127 to Mexican standards and 95 to reference standards.
- 4. All draft technical regulations and sanitary and phytosanitary measures prepared on the basis of this Programme will, in due course, be published in the Oficial Journal for public consultation and, where appropriate, notified to the Secretariat of the World Trade Organization through the Central Registry of Notifications.
- 5. This notification is provided for purposes of transparency and in order to furnish Members with further information on the Mexican regulatory process.
